- Clear definition of harm to self or others
- Harm or endangerment must not be imminent
- Loss of cognitive or volitional control allowed
- Patterns in treatment history allowed

## FLEXIBLE PETITIONERS

- Any responsible adult may petition for commitment
- Clear guidance regarding necessary procedures
- Range of qualified individuals may petition emergently



#### INPATIENT COMMITMENT

Only one professional assessment is required
72 hours allowed for initial assessment of need



- Hospital commitments can be converted
- Renewal of outpatient commitment allowed

# INVOLUNTARY TREATMENT

Provisions for court ordered involuntary medication
Provisions for guardians to require medication

# RIGHTS PROTECTED

- Least restrictive requirement criteria
- Initial timelines specified and reasonable
- Renewal process expressly specified
