



  - 919 *under age of 5*




 In North Dakota, 42% of children removed from their home is due to Parental Substance Abuse


Percent of children entering care for each removal reason (note: multiple reasons may be selected for a single child, Federal Fiscal Year 2017)








 Congregate care placements have decreased by 39% since 2012.

January 2016 - October 2018













 Background checks to purchase a firearm can be completed in minutes through the NICS.

 Federal requirements for child care provider background checks are consistent for each state.

- Search of the State criminal record repository and sex offender registry in the State where the staff member resides and each State where the staff member has resided for the past 5 years;
- 2. Search of the State child abuse and neglect registry in the State where the staff member resides and each State where the staff member has resided for the past 5 years;
- Search of the National Crime Information Center National Sex Offender Registry
- 4. Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) fingerprint check using the Next Generation Identification (which replaced the former Integrated Automated Fingerprint Identification System).

 In-state Background Checks are processed within 12 days.







