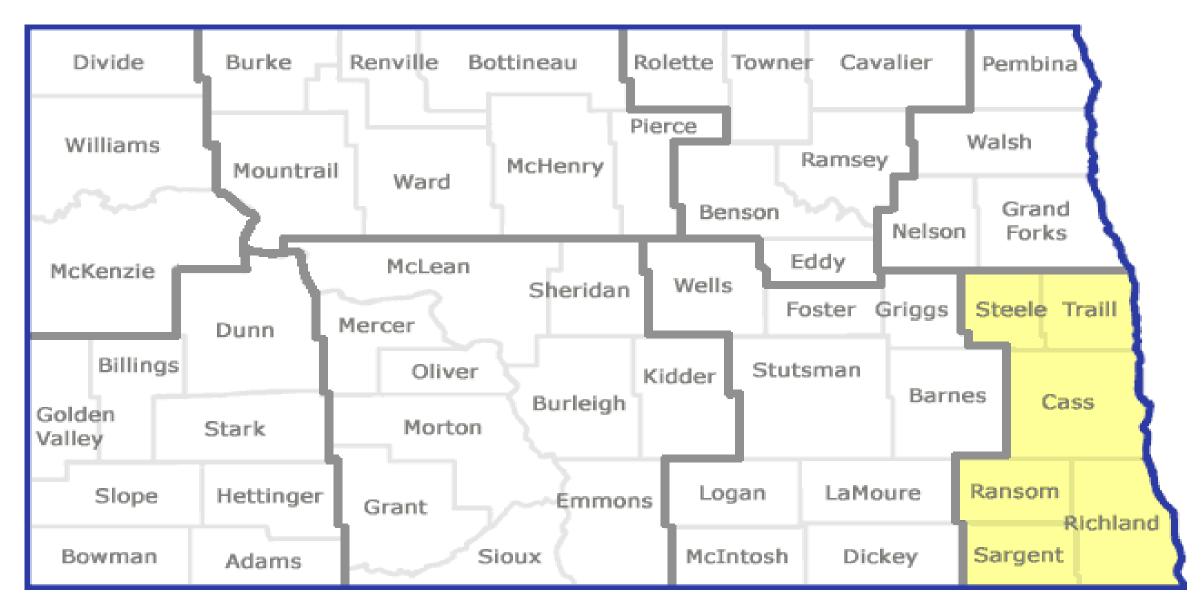

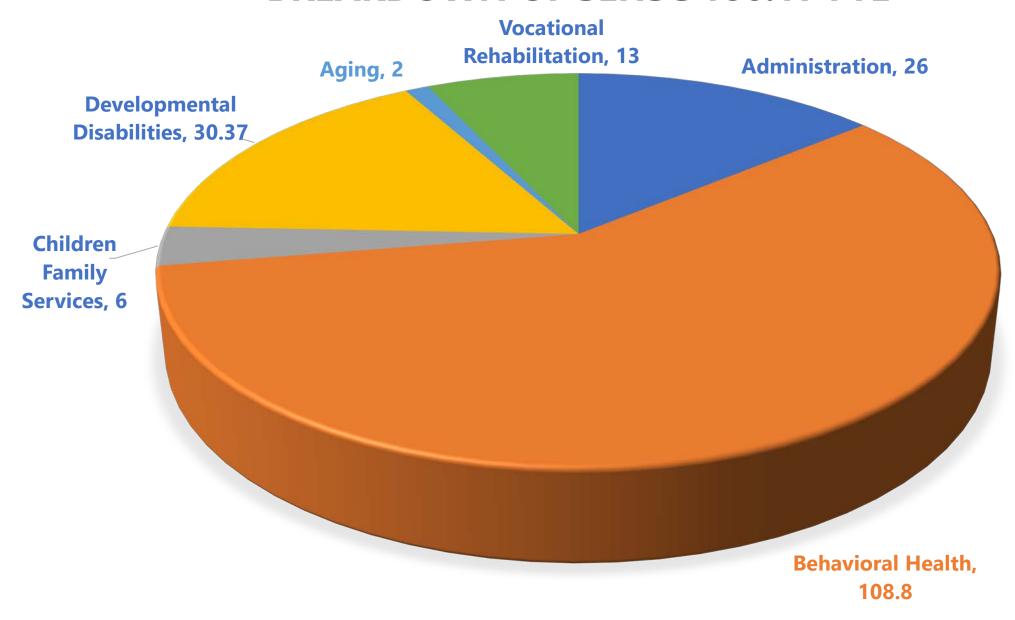

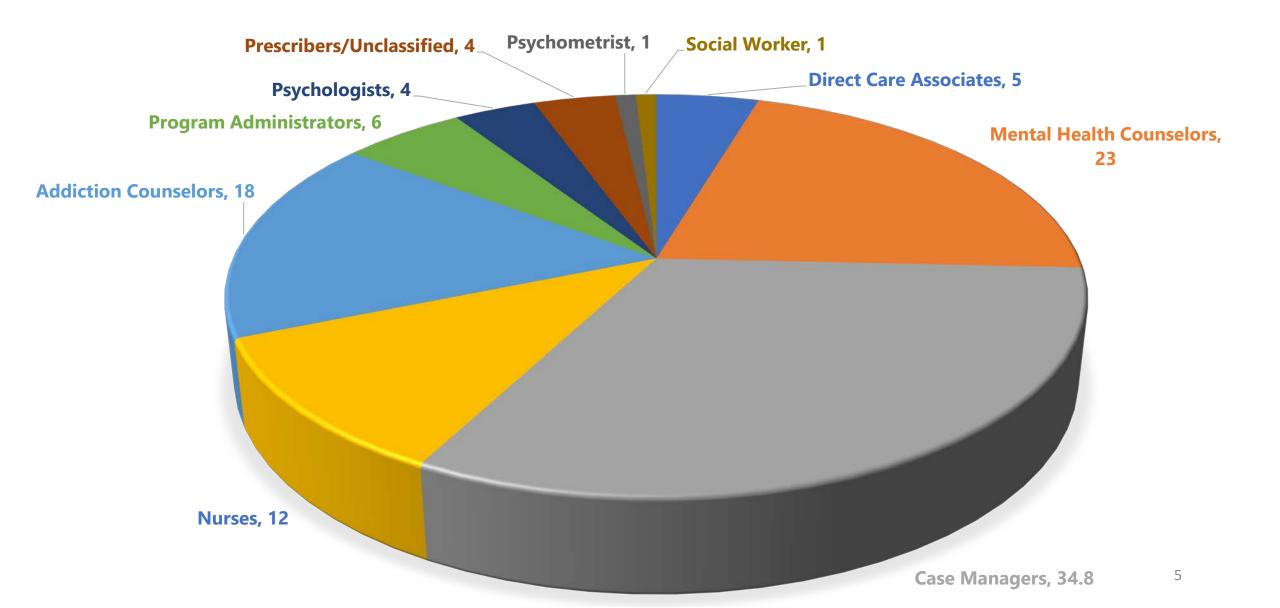

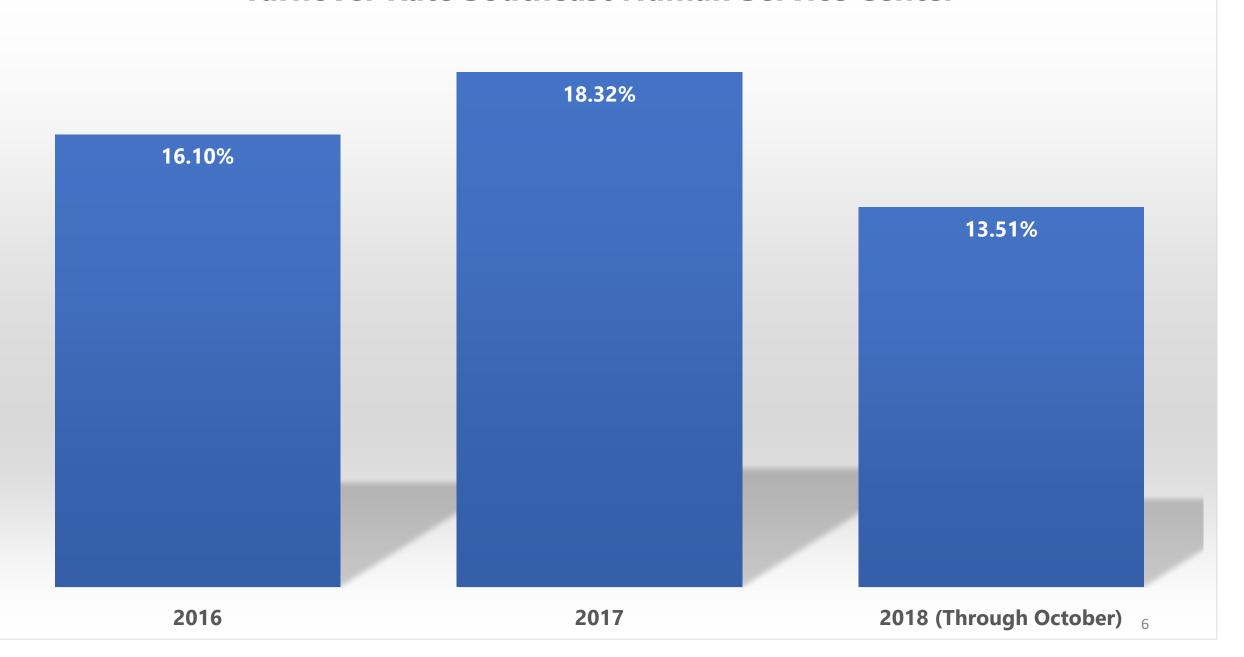
BREAKDOWN OF SEHSC 186.17 FTE



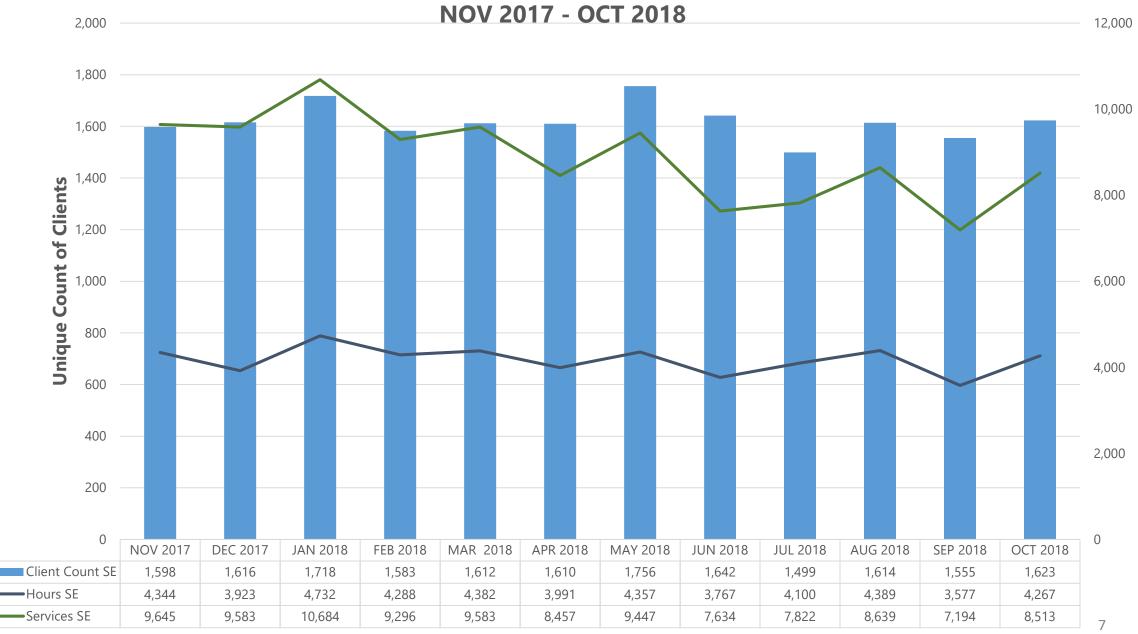
BREAKDOWN OF SEHSC BEHAVIORAL HEALTH 108.8 FTE



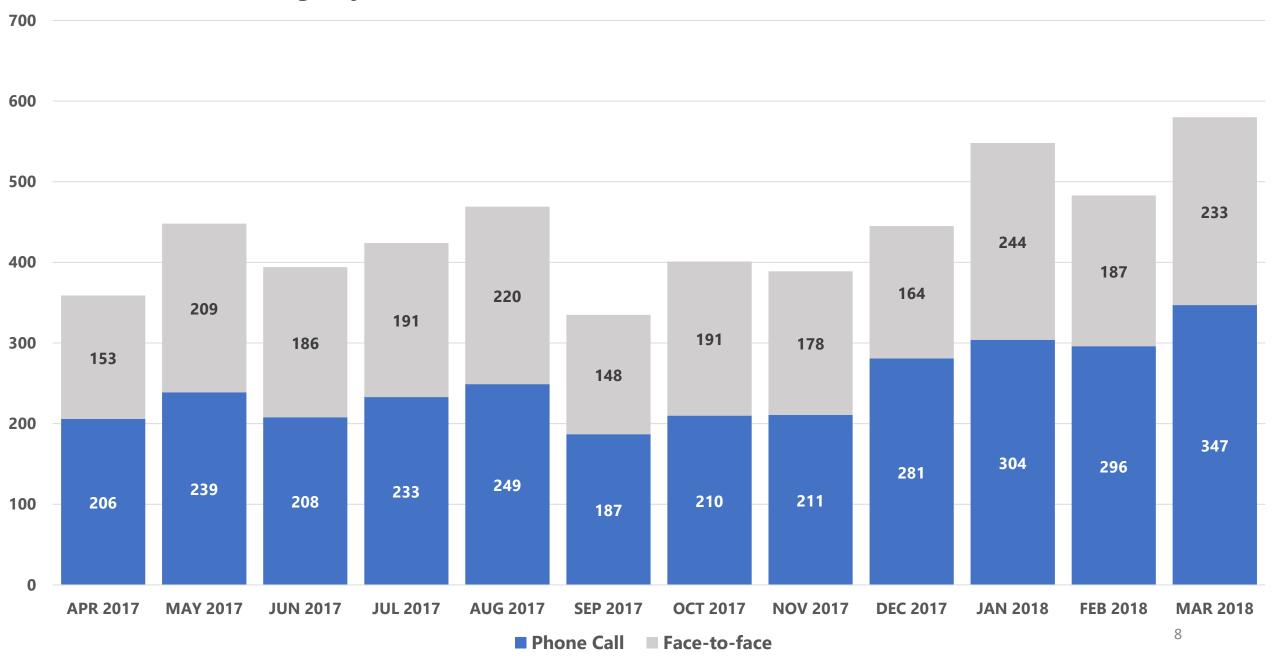

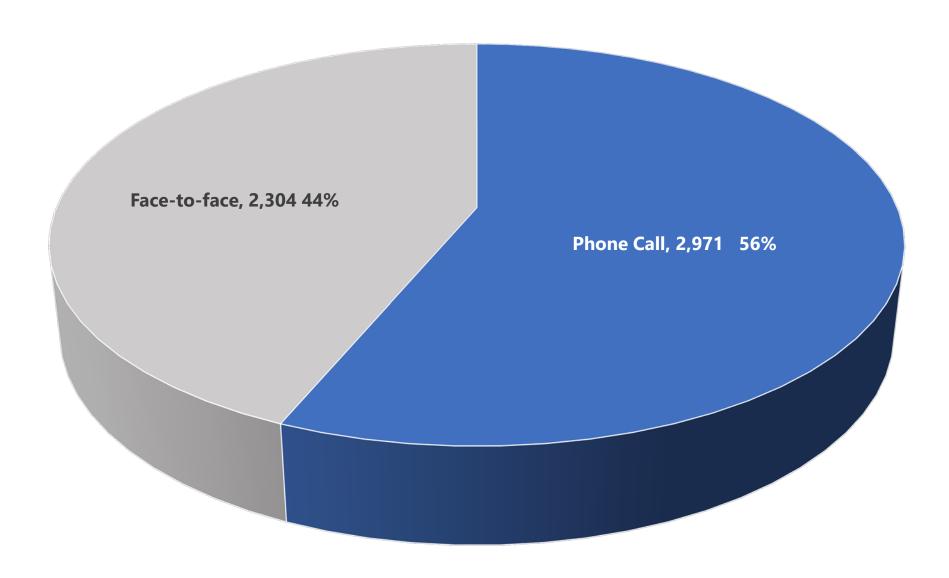
Duration (Hours) of Services, Count of Services, and Unique Count of Clients, SEHSC



Count of Services and Hours



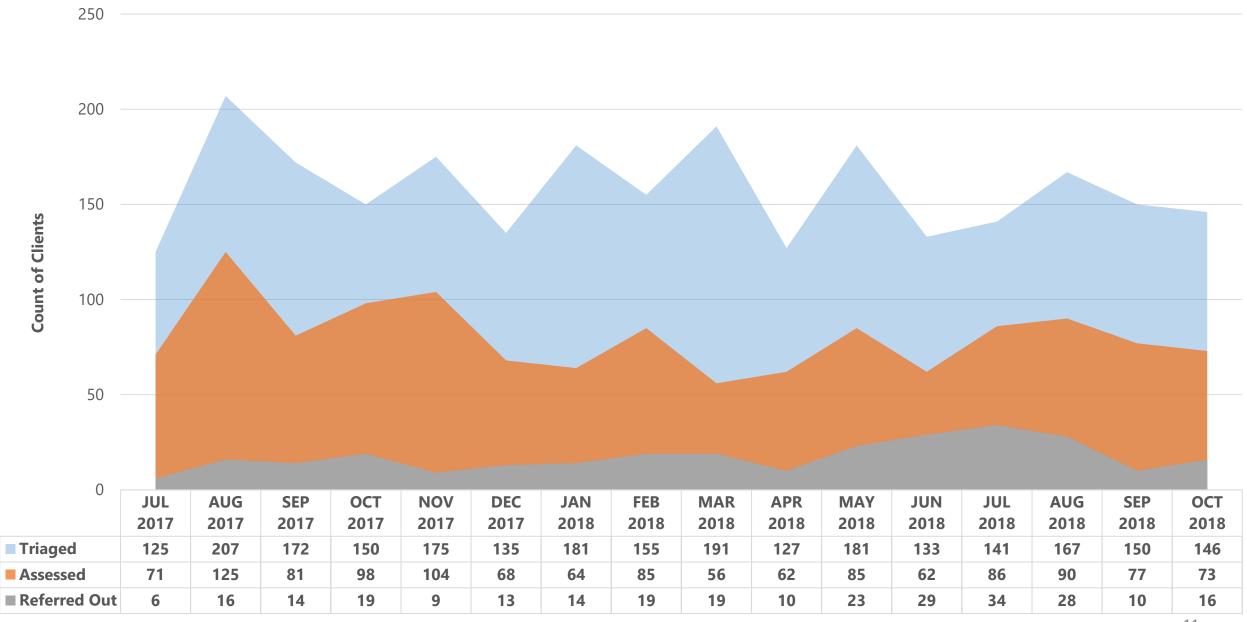
Counts and Percentages of Face-to-Face and Phone Call Emergency Services, SEHSC from APR 2017 through MAR 2018



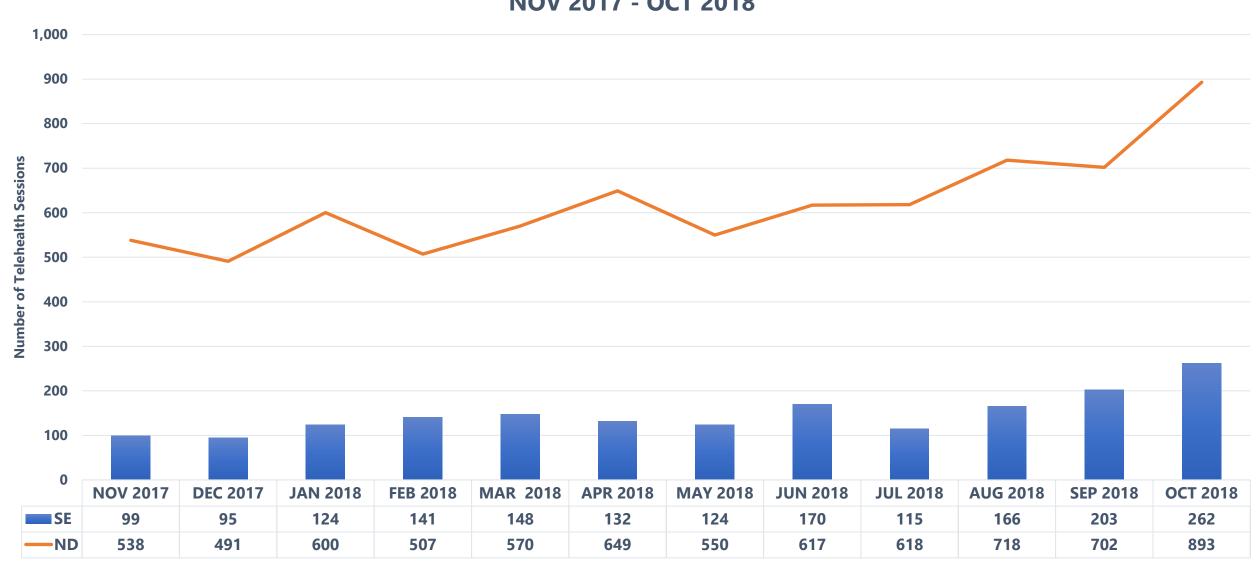

Integrated Dual Disorder Treatment (IDDT)

Initiated January 2007

Inclusion criteria:

- Severe Mental Illness (SMI)/Substance Use Disorder (SUD) diagnosis (co-occurring); Severe Impairments in functioning
- Severe Impairments in functioning as defined that problems are present more than 75% of the time, severe Intensity disrupting the persons' day-to-day life and which happens frequently over the last 30 days
- This level of care refers to team-based services provided to clients capable of living in the community either in supportive or independent settings, but whose treatment needs require intensive management by a multi-disciplinary treatment team. Follows evidence-based fidelity model.

Current caseload: 76

Client outcomes include decrease in intensity, duration, and frequency of symptom and reduction in hospitalizations and higher levels of care.

Assertive Community Treatment (ACT)

Initiated May 2017

Inclusion criteria:

- Adults 18 and over with a Severe Mental Illness diagnosis; severe impairments in functioning
- Severe impairments in functioning as defined that problems are present more than 75% of the time, severe intensity disrupting the persons' day-to-day life and which happens frequently over the last 30 days
- This level of care refers to services provided to clients capable of living in the community either in supportive or independent settings, but whose treatment needs require intensive management by a multi-disciplinary treatment team. Follow evidence-based fidelity model.

Current caseload: 77

Outcomes currently being collected, intention to reduce duration, intensity, frequency of symptoms; recovery-oriented. One area of outcomes available: 22 individuals currently connected with Community Options for supported employment with 6 clients actively working (dollar savings of decreased hospitalizations/ER visits plus contributions through gaining employment = positive income for client, integrated back into the community)

Multisystemic Therapy (MST)-Psychiatric

Initiated June 2018

Inclusion Criteria:

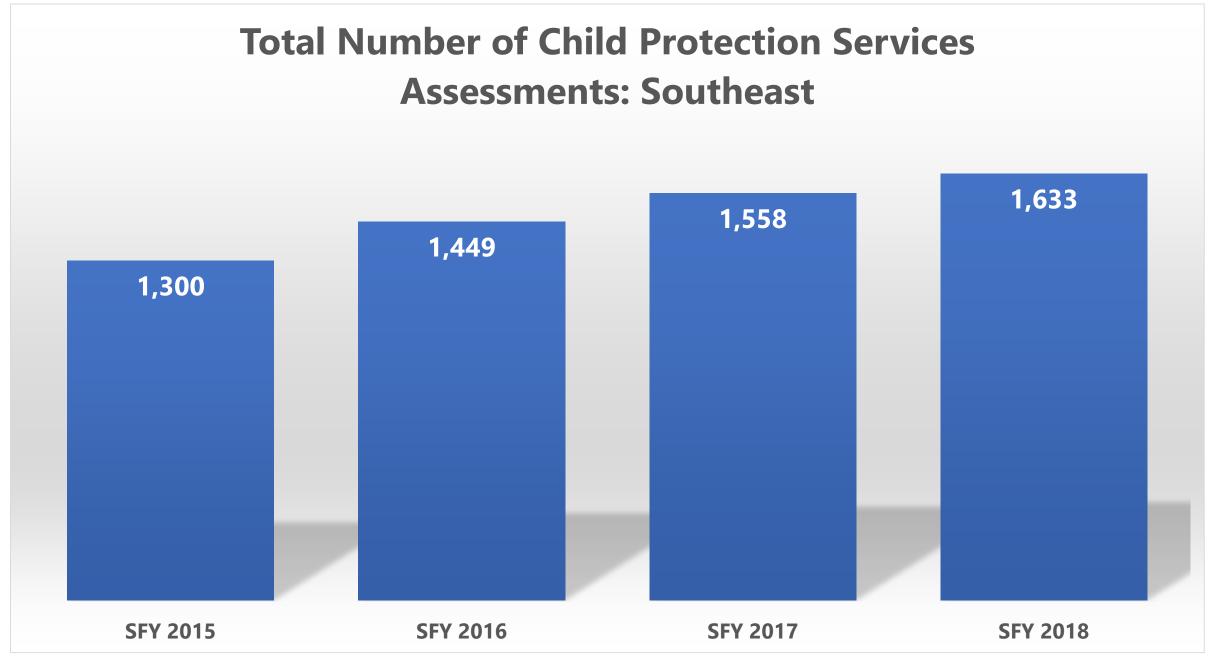
 Youth between the ages of 9 and 17 years old, at risk of out-of-home placement due to serious behavioral problems and co-occurring mental health symptoms such as thought disorder, bipolar affective disorder, depression, anxiety, impulsivity and substance use/abuse. Youth with co-morbid psychiatric symptoms and substance use/abuse are appropriate referrals.

26 referrals to date and have opened 8 cases total.

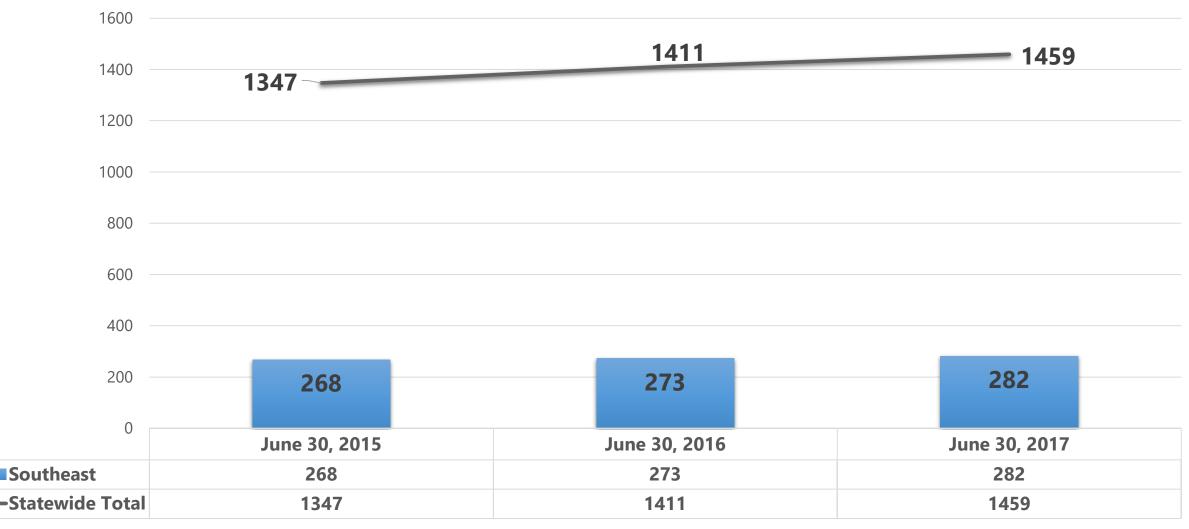
- There were 3 cases closed between June 1 and Dec. 5, 2018. Since Dec. 5, 2018, two additional families have successfully completed MST, with one pending successful closure in the coming weeks. Of the 3 cases closed 2 were still in school and had no new arrests. 1 of the 3 cases was placed out of the home due to ongoing legal activity. One case closed due to lack of caregiver participation.
- Current caseload: 5 cases and currently reviewing 4 referrals.

Unduplicated Count of Developmental Disabilities Program Clients: Southeast HSC





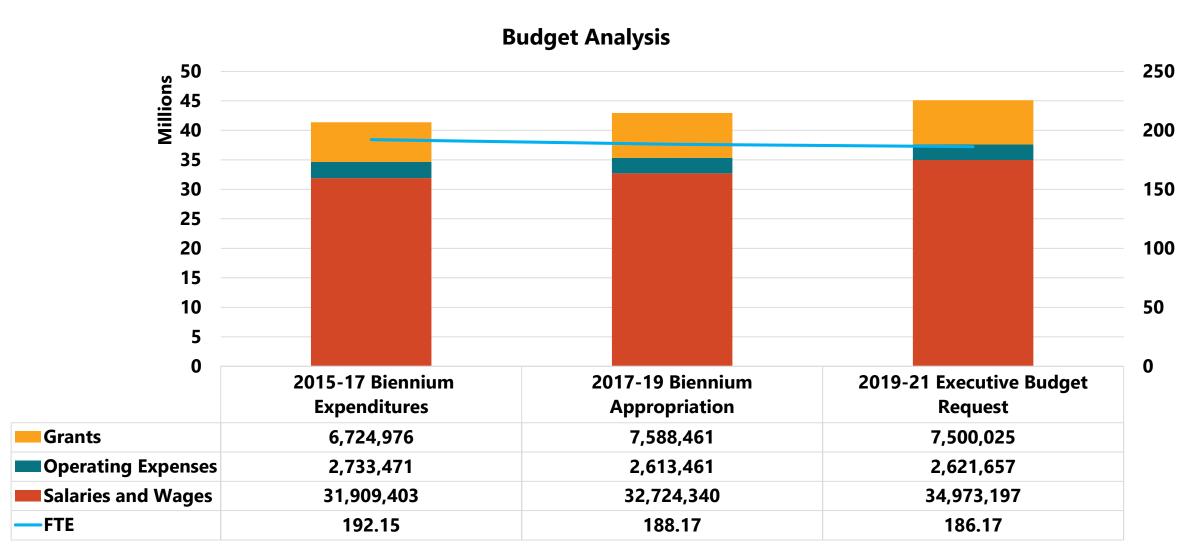
Number of Children in Foster Care on the Last Day of the State Fiscal Year Southeast Region



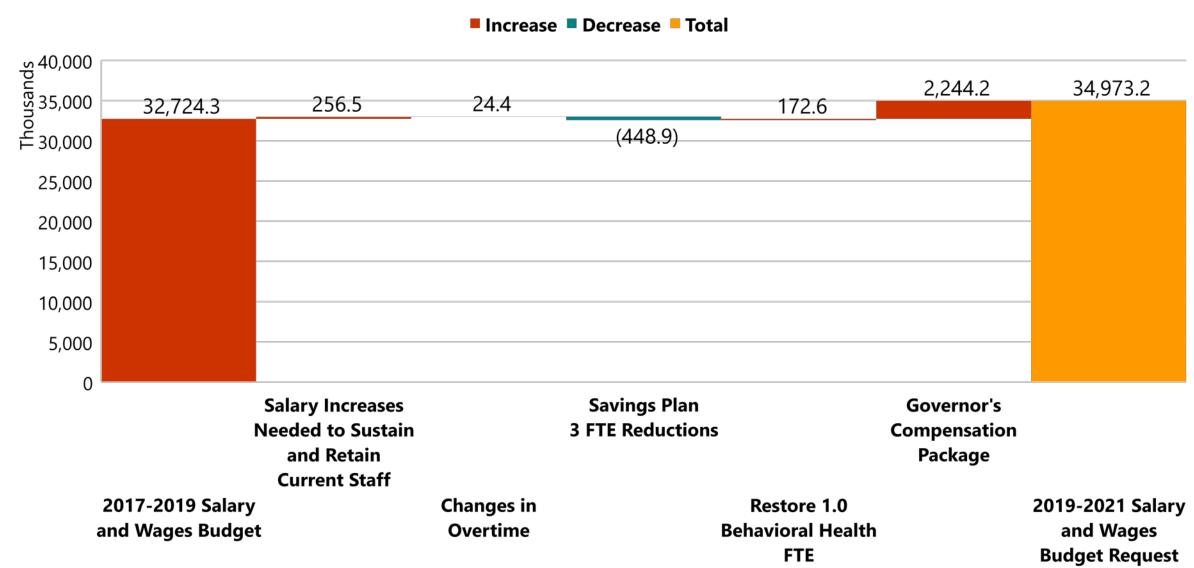

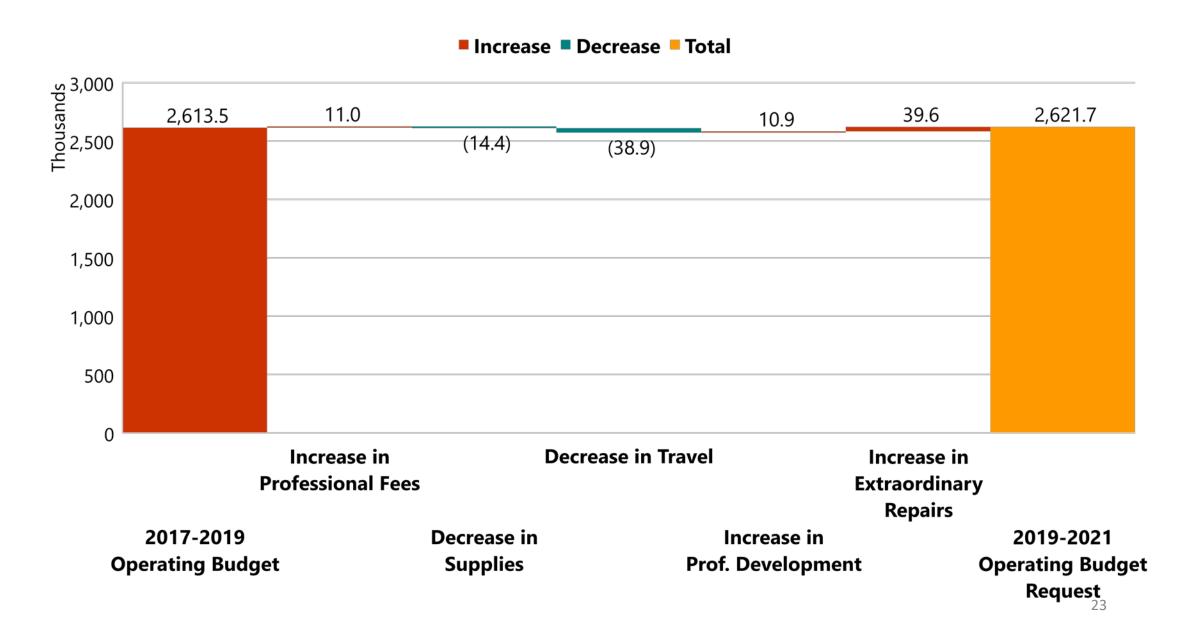

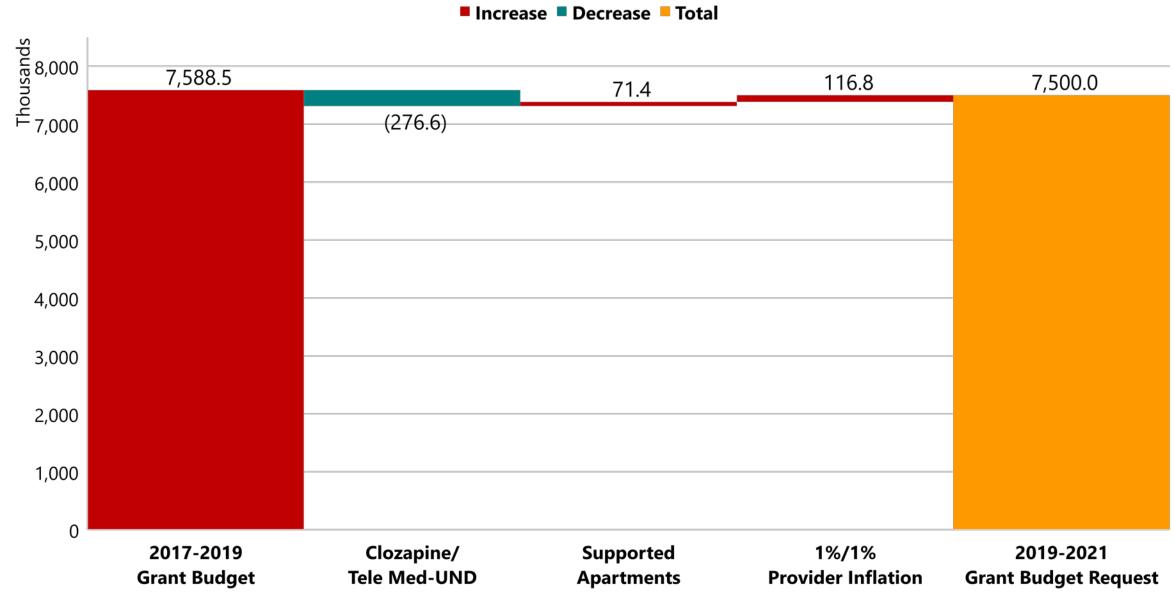
MAJOR SALARY AND WAGES DIFFERENCES
